

**Coastal Health and Non-Point Source Overlapping Issues
Conference Call Notes from May 10, 2005
11:30AM CT**

The six (6) overlapping issues identified by the Executive Committee include:

1. Nutrients
2. Toxic chemicals
3. Septic system runoff
4. Urban storm water
5. Rural storm water
6. CSOs/SSOs

Resolution on overlapping issues:

1. Nutrients
 - NPS will primarily cover this topic, focusing on mitigation and remediation of sources.
 - CH will reference the NPS paper and will mention the topic only in regards to algal blooms and beach sands (i.e., the effects).
2. Toxic chemicals
 - NPS will primarily cover this topic, focusing on wetlands and buffer strips as means of mitigating non-point sources of contaminated sediments.
 - CH will mention the topic only in regards to monitoring for health and fish consumption.
3. Septic system runoff
 - CH will primarily cover this topic, although it may be lower priority and fall to an appendix.
 - NPS will mention the topic only as a lower priority item in an appendix.
4. Urban storm water
 - CH will primarily cover this topic, focusing on mitigation and encompassing both CSOs/SSOs and MS4s.
 - NPS will mention preventative practices in urban areas, i.e., BMPs that impact this topic at a distance (upland of urban areas), retrofits to reduce impervious surfaces and channelization.
5. Rural storm water
 - NPS will primarily cover this topic as it relates to maintaining natural flow regimes and watersheds, reducing sediment, and protecting infiltration areas.
6. CSOs/SSOs
 - CH will primarily cover this topic as it relates to urban storm water management.

Additional notes:

- Cadmus will assist with further definition and reduction of overlap between the urban and rural storm water recommendations.
- There are no overlapping issues to add to the list.
- There are no unresolved overlapping issues to elevate to the Executive Committee.
